

WOODSTOCK FOLK FESTIVAL, INC. (WFF) is a non-profit, all-volunteer organization based in Woodstock, Illinois, 47 miles northwest of Chicago. Its purpose is to bring quality folk music – local, national, and international – to Northern Illinois. To this end WFF sponsors a **day-long summer Festival** on historic Woodstock Square on the third Sunday of July each year as well as some **concerts.** Woodstock is one of the National Trust for Historic Preservation's Distinctive Destinations; it was the film location for the movie <u>Groundhog Day</u>.



The 34th Annual Woodstock Folk Festival will be held on Sunday, July 21, 2019, from Noon-6 p.m., on Woodstock Square. We will present this year's Lifetime Achievement Award to Anne Hills (photo) and our "Woody" Awards to Sue Kessell and Juel Ulven. The LeftOvers will open the Festival and lead the All-Sing Finale. Other Main Stage performers will include Scott Ainslie, Joe Crookston, Gathering Sparks, Zoe Mulford, Cari Ray & the Shaky Legs, and Windborne. Scott Ainslie will offer a Blues Workshop. Rick Fitzgerald will be the Featured Performer at the Open Mic Stage. The Children's Area offers hands-on activities. Chuck VanderVennet and Rich Warren co-host the Festival's Main Stage. Real Woodstock and the Woodstock Opera House will offer additional events on this "Folk Weekend," including a concert by **Robbie Fulks** on Friday night. Some of the Festival will commemorate through music the 50th Anniversary of the First Lunar Landing and Moonwalk which occurred July 20-21, 1969 and the 50th Anniversary of the Woodstock Music Festival held in Upstate New York on August 15-18, 1969, a pivotal moment in popular music history.
